### **Job Summary**

Reporting to the Lands and Resources Director, this position is responsible for monitoring and assessing wildlife and fisheries that exist within the traditional territory of Selkirk First Nation. The position will monitor resources, enforce regulations and mentor SFN staff in the practical application of Fish and Wildlife principles. This position demands considerable periods of time spent out on the traditional territory and the ability to develop strong relationships with the Northern Tutchone Elders, recognizing the value of traditional knowledge. The position will also assist in the implementation of the Self Government Implementation Plan as it pertains to fish & wildlife by assisting in the development of protocols, standards and regulations.

### **Education/Experience**

- Diploma or Degree in fish and/or wildlife biology, renewable resource management or related field of study, with relevant experience with fisheries and/or wildlife management and enforcement
- An equivalent combination of education, training and experience working within a FN environment in any of the areas listed above.

### **Knowledge and Skills**

- Knowledge of regulatory and legal frameworks that affect individuals accessing living resources within the SFN Traditional territories
- Knowledge of computing programs (MS Office, and others) and records management practices that are available to enhance resource management service delivery
- Strong judgement, time management, and evaluative skills
- Strong interpersonal skills including tact, diplomacy, as well as collaborative and conflict management skills
- Strong written and oral communication skills
- Ability to provide educational programming within area of expertise for SFN staff, citizens, and the general public
