Job Summary:

Reporting to the Lead CSO, the Community Security Officer (CSO) is responsible for ensuring the day-to-day safety of citizens, and for providing a professional, visible and proactive point of contact for citizens. The position is responsible for developing and maintain trust and positive relationships with citizens, partners and stakeholders, the CSO will also act as a referral agent and point of contact for external partners and stakeholders. Maintains safe and secure environment for SFN Citizens, Community Members and employees by patrolling and monitoring premises and personnel and responding to minor incidents to provide support and intervention.

Main Duties:

- Patrolling and monitoring within Selkirk First Nation Traditional Territory and engaging and communicating with citizens
- Intervening and reporting to crisis, emergency or routine situations that require, or appear to require justice involvement in coordination with the RCMP.
- Providing investigative support to external partners such as RCMP, Yukon Justice and Public Safety Canada and other related contractors
- Logging entries and inputting data of shift activity into the tracking system
- Providing support to citizens and external partners during third party interventions
- Providing referrals to external stakeholders and partners
- Maintaining the company vehicle
- Other related duties as determined by the Lead CSO

Education and Experience:

- Grade 12, Graduation Equivalency Diploma (GED) or equivalent
- Basic security training from an accredited institution (eg..RCMP or BC Justice Institute)
- Experience working with people in crisis
- Experience working within the formal justice system in the areas of youth justice, adult protection, corrections, probations or social welfare
- Experience working in a First Nation community.
Knowledge of Aboriginal Peoples history with formal justice, residential and child welfare systems and familiarity with Selkirk First Nation history, culture, goals and aspirations

Conditions of Employment:

- Willingness to work 'shift work', including weekends and holidays
- Physical capacity to perform the duties necessary of Security Officer in the environment and conditions of the SFN traditional territory
- Possession and maintenance of a Class 5 Driver's license & acceptable driver's abstract
- Criminal Record check

- Oath of Intoxicants
